

Educators will work to improve math abilities/skills in all areas associated with Math and provide data to demonstrate growth.









Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 3314.03(D)(2) specifies that the sponsor of the school must “monitor and evaluate the academic and fiscal performance and the organization and operation of the community school on at least an annual basis.”

In its evaluation of the school performance, the Ohio Department of Education’s Office of Ohio School Sponsorship assesses the performance of A+ Arts Academy on each of the required Ohio School Report Card indicators and on performance measures listed in the charter contract.

The Ohio Department of Education’s Office of Ohio School Sponsorship monitors the performance of the community schools through our attendance at the A+ Arts Academy board meetings, visits to the school, monthly review of financial reports and reviews of academic progress reports along with other reports related to the school’s performance.

The Ohio Department of Education’s Office of Ohio School Sponsorship was the sponsor for A+ Arts Academy during the 2019-2020 school year.
